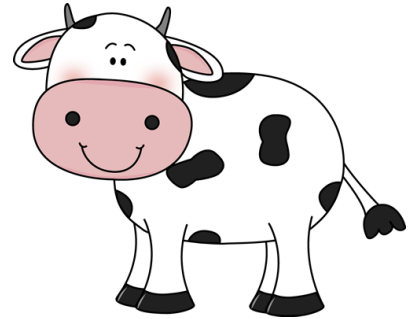
Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type

Before You Read: *Looking at the cover, ask, "What are the cows doing?" "How do you know when an animal wants something?" "Could this really happen?"*

Reading Time!: *Read the story aloud to your child. As you read, pause each time there is a note. Ask your child to predict what the note might say.*

After You Read: *Ask the questions: "What do you think your pet would say if it could talk?" "What could Farmer Brown have done differently?"*



Pick an Activity!

Barnyard Bubble!

Pour some bubbles in a bucket and get ready to blow! For each bubble your child blows, try to name something that starts with the letter B. For an added challenge, have your child name objects that end with the letter B.

Click, Clack, Moo...Click, Clack, Moo practice making a pattern or two!

Take a quick look back at the pattern the author used in the story: "Click, Clack, Moo...Click, Clack, Moo...Clickety, Clack, Moo." Can you make the pattern? Come up with another type of challenge, have your child create a pattern using 3 to 4 objects, crayons, & a piece of paper.

Got Milk?



The cows in the story refused to make any milk if their demands were not met. What would happen if there was no milk?

Think of items that are made from milk. How many can you think of? For an added treat, share a milk related product like a bowl of ice cream or a milkshake!

Write About It!

Did you expect cows would be able to type? Write a story about an animal that can do something unexpected, like frogs who play jazz music or a bear who can tap dance.
